Logansport pursuing electric and water Supervisor, Brad McBride meters that can be read remotely

Logansport Municipal Utilities employees soon won't have to jump fences, face off with dogs or worry about tripping over things in people's yards just to read the meters — or turn them off.

LMU has started the process of getting both water and electric meters the department can read remotely, as well as remotely shut off service or check for problems such as water leaks, outages or people trying to alter their meters to pay less.

It also means repairs can be identified earlier and made easier, said LMU Spokeswoman Lorri Foster.

There's no set date for the change, and it may be some time.

First, LMU has to negotiate the contract with the national firm Sensus, the firm the LMU officials chose.

The negotiations will include the city's and the business' responsibilities, the equipment, installation, work timelines and final costs, said Foster.

LMU's Electric Metering Department Supervisor Brad McBride said there isn't a final price. However, with Sensus, costs will come in less than the \$5.5 million estimated. After materials are ordered, it could take up to 12 months for the materials to arrive due to current shortages, he said.

Then LMU employees will have to replace roughly 12,600 electric meters and 7,600 water meters. "It is probably going to be a yearlong project," said McBride.


