The Hoosier of hospitality , Paoli, Indiana

Paoli is a town in Paoli Township, Orange County, Indiana, United States.

Paoli was laid out and platted in 1816. It was named for Pasquale Paoli Ash, the son of North Carolina governor Samuel Ashe. A post office has been in operation at Paoli since 1817.

In its first decades, it was noted as a Quaker town that played a role in the Underground Railroad by transporting enslaved people from the South to Canada. In the 1900s it became known as the site of the Pioneer Mothers Memorial Forest, a surviving fragment of the once-extensive virgin oak forest of southern Indiana.

In addition to its historical charm, Paoli embraces the natural beauty of its surroundings. The area is dotted with rolling hills, serene parks, and nearby lakes, providing residents and visitors with ample opportunities for outdoor recreation.



Paoli Peaks, a popular winter destination, attracts skiing and snowboarding enthusiasts, adding a touch of adventure to the town's offerings. Whether strolling through the historic district or enjoying the scenic landscapes, Paoli invites individuals to experience the warmth of a close-knit community and the allure of a town that gracefully balances its rich history with the beauty of the Indiana countryside.
