MAYOR DAVE WOOD ANNOUNCES APPOINTMENT OF ELECTRIC DIVISION MANAGER/MISHAWAKA UTILITIES

Mayor Dave Wood announces that Kevin Wasmer has been promoted to Electric Division Manager for the Mishawaka Utilities Electric Division. Wasmer replaces Sedric Springman who retired in May of 2021 after serving the Electric Division for 21 years and as the Electric Division Manager since 2015.

The Electric Division Manager serves under Mayor Dave Wood and reports to the Board of Public Works and Safety. This position is responsible for managing, directing, planning and administrating the efficient distribution of electricity in the utility franchise boundary. This includes managing and directing the engineering and technical support for electric distribution and all maintenance, construction and repair of electric distribution.

"I feel that Kevin brings the knowledge, experience and familiarity with our electric division necessary to be successful in this position," comments Mayor Dave Wood. "He has spent 23 years in this department, and I am sure that we can expect a seamless transition of Kevin into his new position as Electric Division Manager."

Kevin joined the Mishawaka Utilities Electric Division in 1998 as a Project Coordinator, became an Engineering Assistant in 2000, a Senior Engineering Assistant in 2003 and has served as a Project Manager since 2007. During his career he has implemented the first major substation upgrade in nearly two decades by converting the Union Street Substation from a 4kv to 12kv distribution

He led a \$1.1 million, 13-month primary electric service project for the Saint Joseph Regional Medical Center, designed and managed primary electric layout of two large shopping malls, Toscana Park & Heritage Square, lead multiple city road widening projects and city redevelopment projects and coordinated and managed a \$2 million, 12-month fiber optic project for the City of Mishawaka. He has a strong dedication and commitment to the Mishawaka Electric Division with experience in process flow while serving in a leadership role that includes quick and solid decision making.

"Kevin understands the importance of providing the world-class service to the citizens of Mishawaka that they have come to know and deserve," comments Mayor Wood. "He has already proven his dedication to the Electric Department and City, and I look forward to working with him."
