## Five Basic Safety Rules Everyone Must Follow

## 1. Keep Work Areas Clean

Good housekeeping prevents injuries like slips, trips, falls, lacerations, and strains. A clean workspace is a safer workspace.

2. Use the Proper Tool for the Job

Never improvise. Using the right tool helps avoid damage, injury, and rework.

3. Always Wear the Proper PPE

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is your last line of defense. Wear what's required for the job every time.

- Communicate Hazards to Others
   Don't assume others know the risks. Always share safety information—especially with new or rotating team
   members.
- 5. Stop Work to Address Hazards

If something doesn't look or feel safe, STOP. Report the hazard, get help, and fix the issue before moving forward.
