Communication Saves Lives

Clear communication is just as important as any tool we use

Before starting work, make sure everyone understands:

- The job plan
- Roles and responsibilities
- Potential hazards
- Emergency procedures
- Use radios or pre-agreed hand signals when visibility or noise is an issue.
- Double-confirm instructions, especially before energizing or isolating equipment.
- Don't assume someone else heard you — get verbal confirmation when needed.

Best Practice:

Do a “Take 5” pause before critical tasks — confirm plan, hazards, and signals.
